- * = Table reflects the minimum qualifications. Incumbents in parenthetical positions must also satisfy the certification requirements and firefighter duty position they hold. For example, a firefighter (paramedic) filling a crew chief position must meet the certification requirements for crew chief.

- Notes:
- 1. This chart depicts the minimum certification requirements to occupy positions indicated. Local managers determine additional training and certifications for Service- or installation-specific missions
 - 2. Time in grade is based on firefighter duties. Grades based on parenthetical duties do not satisfy time in grade requirements. For example, a GS-9 firefighter (paramedic) that would otherwise be a GS-6 firefighter will not meet time in grade requirements for a GS-10 firefighter position even though they may have one year experience as a GS-9 firefighter (paramedic).
